Women will be well represented on the Olympc team. A women's softball team comprised mainly of women from the 1270 softball team in the Beantown Softball League, will be a strong entry. This team has played for two years in the well-established local league and even beat the champion Chaps team in a scrimmage game. With more depth at every position, the team has greatly improved on its first season. They have practiced regularly throughout the summer and emphasize good defense and selective hitting.

Although the majority of women from the Boston Chapter of the Gay Olympics are participating in the softball tournament there are several other outstanding female athletes who will be participating in boxing, billiards, physique, marathon, and running events. Men's individual athletes will include a swimmer, a tennis player, two bowlers, and several runners.

Doug Stenson is a marathon runner who is also a member of the Athletic Congress. He participated in the GayRun82 in New York this spring and is also a member of the Front Runners.

Most of the players on the Olympic basketball team have played together for at least two years. Last winter they played at Boston City Hospital and at UMass-Boston. Two of the teammates are from Boston's original basketball team of several years ago, and a few of the others have played as much as five years with the team. The team features an ex-collegiate starting center and several former high school players.
