In conclusion, I urge all of our members to attend the year-end banquet and general membership meeting where I will ask you to consider my candidacy for re-election as your Commissioner. I will, as will other candidates, make a presentation and discuss the issues facing our League next year. At that time I will be more precise in answering questions that you may have.

Members of the Beantown Softball League,

I welcome the opportunity to serve as your commissioner for the next two seasons and appreciate your taking the time to consider my candidacy. We are fortunate to be members of a well-run organization, one in which I hope to become more active as the next league commissioner.

So the first question I've been asked since deciding to run: Why are you interested? And I've also been hearing: What would you like to accomplish? And a few others have wanted to know: What are your qualifications? I hope this statement answers those questions, and more, and hope that you'll check off my name when voting at the league banquet.

Why am I interested? As a 13-year member of the league, including coaching the last two years (Joe V's in 2006, Manhunt in 2007), I've benefited tremendously and would like to give something back to the league. The Beantown Softball League, along with other sports organizations I've participated in, has done so much for me, both on the field and off. I've made an amazing group of friends, been able to travel around the country (and the world – Gay Games in Sydney 2002 was spectacular) to play in tournaments, and want to help continue the league's track record of leadership and growth.

I also feel I have a set of skills and qualities that can help the league. For example, I'm extremely committed and will – if elected – do all that I can to ensure a successful two years of softball. I'm a natural leader who has the respect of many in our league, and the larger community, including the gay media. My organizational skills are highly developed as most of my professional career has been spent in event planning and fundraising, which will also benefit the league. And I truly enjoy being involved – it's my "thing" you could say.

What would I like to accomplish? I have a ton of ideas but realize it's important to gather feedback and consensus from the membership, especially the executive committee, before moving forward. Having said that, a few of my ideas include: hosting a national tournament on an annual basis; continuing to expand the league each year; establishing a relationship between the league and the gay media to include weekly scores, standings and schedules being published; exploring the idea of All-Star games (by division); and streamlining some of the administrative processes the league utilizes.

I'm a big proponent of soliciting feedback and if I'm the next commissioner I would work with the executive committee, and the membership at large, to help determine the league's direction. I plan to be available to the membership, on the fields and off, to talk about the league and any concerns, ideas, or suggestions you have.

What are my qualifications? As I mentioned I've been a member of the BSL for 13 seasons now and have done double duty the last two while playing for the Crew and coaching a new team. I've been fortunate enough to participate in 7 Gay Softball World Series tournaments, including 2000 in Toronto when the Jackhammers were NAGAAA "B" Division champions. I've supported league fundraisers over the years, and have been an active member of the teams I've played on (Fenway Falcons, Buzz Boys, Jackhammers, and Club Café Crew). This year I served on the Friends & Family Day

planning committee, with Sandro Frattura, Chris Hagberg, and Kevin Hourihan. And I've worked with the other Division 3 teams for our pre-season scrimmage day and post-season practices as we prepare for Labor Day tournaments.

For six years I served as commissioner of the Boston Gay Basketball League and during my tenure the league expanded from 8 teams to 21, and from one division to three (competitive, recreational, and women's). I also established the Boston Tea Party Classic national tournament and served as tournament director for four years. While commissioner I also created the league's annual Summer 3-on-3 Tournament and the All-Star Game, which continues to this day. And I ensured the financial success of the league by being in the black at least \$1,000 each year I was in office. I was honored by the Chicago Windy City Classic at its 10 year anniversary by being enshrined into its Hall of Fame for contribution to gay basketball nationally (and certainly not for my jump shot!).

In 2001 I founded PrideSports Boston and served as its executive director for four years. Under my leadership the organization networked more than 20 GLBT sports organizations in metro Boston. We created a website through which we were able to promote sports in our community; we established a hotline that each sport could utilize – the BSL uses it to announce weather-related delays or cancellations; and we established a presence for sports organizations in the annual Boston Pride Parade. In addition, I was responsible – with BSL member Andy Ryder – for establishing the "Out at Fenway Park" event, one of the largest events for the GLBT sports community. Over three years we averaged approximately 700 fans in the seats for a particular game, and worked with Machine for the pre- and post-game festivities.

Last on my "sports resume" is my current involvement with the FLAG Flag Football league. For three years I've served on the board as Director of Communications. My role involves managing all league correspondence, especially to the membership; maintaining the league website; organizing the Year End Party; and taking/distributing minutes at all league meetings. During the season I officiate games (when not playing), assist at all league events, and participate in all board decisions. Last season the league added a number of new events, including our first annual Pro Bowl which I developed.

Final thoughts? I recognize that you have a decision to make and ask you to consider me as a viable candidate for league commissioner. I welcome your thoughts, comments and ideas.
