Lessons learned from the balance sheet perspective:

- 1) There are numerous areas (transportation and fields specifically) where we probably spent money we didn't have to. These expenditures reduced the bottom line, but were done with the best of intents.
- 2) We were probably over-reliant on the Coors sponsorship money. Better League attendance at the Casino Night would have increased our net as well.
- 3) We underbudgeted for the Banquet. Fortunately our costs in other areas helped compensate for this.

Report of The Events Committee

The Minuteman Classic Events Committee held its preliminary meeting on February 19, 2002. The focus of the meeting was to discuss preliminary ideas for "special events" for the Minuteman Classic and to draft a preliminary budget to underwrite said events.

It was almost the immediate consensus of those present that "special events" should be limited to the following considerations: 1. Hospitality Room during tournament registration, 2. Opening ceremonies and 3. An Awards Ceremony / Closing Reception.

Other things have been suggested, such as a Boston Duck Tour, but the Committee feels these are better suited as alternative activities rather than events. Perhaps we could however arrange for a special discount for such activities for tournament participants.

Hospitality Room

The committee feels that this responsibility would be best handled by (or in conjunction with) the Registration Committee; since it would undoubtedly coincide with registration at the host hotel. It is also felt that since the bar would be a cash bar that the Doubletree management could be talked into providing hoer's d oeuvres etc. Therefore we see no need to request a preliminary budget for this event.

Opening Ceremonies

There seems to be no firm tradition with regard to "*opening ceremonies*" at softball tournaments. It was the Chair's observation that most weekend tournaments usually do not have formal opening ceremonies. This seems to be more a tradition of the NAGAAA World Series.

If we do adopt a formal opening ceremonies, it is suggested that it be scheduled between the first and second round of opening games to assure a great attendance and that it consist of nothing more elaborate than the playing or singing of the national anthems of the United States of America and Canada and perhaps the throwing out of a ceremonial "first pitch" by a dignitary. Therefore we feel no special budget item need be established for the opening ceremonies.

Award Ceremonies/Closing Reception

To a man. The committee felt that the Award Ceremonies/Closing Reception should be the primary focus of the Events Committee and that we should strive to

send the tournament participants home with both a weekend of great tournament play and a closing ceremony they would long remember.

Accordingly we would like the venue for this reception to have a special "taste of Boston." Among some of the sites discussed were The Kennedy Library, 600 Club, John Hancock Observatory, Boston Public Library, State House, Quincy Market Cyclorama, Niketown, Avalon and even a boat cruise.

However, since the primary purpose of the committee meeting was to draft a proposed budget for presentation at the next Tournament Committee Meeting; we limited detailed discussion to the committee's estimated expenditure needs. Realizing that, with the exception of the Athletic Committee's financial needs, our request would probably be the tournament's highest

After much discussion the committee decided that, based on a projected attendance of 300 event participants, that we request a budget of \$20.00 per person, or \$6,000. (Note: This request does not include any estimate for transportation cost to/from the event should the full committee deem transportation advisable.) In addition it was voted that the events committee also be allowed to directly solicit business sponsors for this event, with the proviso that said sponsors not be in conflict with any other major sponsors of the tournament.

Follow Up

Since the committee's meeting; the Chair has had preliminary discussions with the manager of Niketown and, at his request, the Vice President for Community and Government Relations at Northeastern University has spoken to a senior member of the Kennedy family, and the Office of Senator Kerry regarding the use of the JFK Library. In addition, with the Red Sox playing an evening game on Sunday, May 26th, the use of the 600 Club and Avalon as venues for the Closing Reception seem highly unlikely.
